About the song:

"La Guacamaya" is a son jarocho standard from Veracruz in Mexico. A guacamaya is a parrot, and in the most widely sung original version (much like a version recently made popular by Los Lobos), the parrot is sad because he's hungry, yet he's able to fly away to a better place.

About the genre: Son jorocho is an Spanish/Creole/African musical fusion from Mexico's southern coastal plan area of Veracruz. The music is consciously repetitive and full of call and responses so community members can participate by singing, dancing and playing their instruments along with the band. San Jorocho musicians gather often in public festive musical and dance jams called "fandangos," during which all members of the community are welcome to participate in the music making. Often the musicians improvise lyrics based upon the rough outlines of a set of standard, well-known songs.
